

Low Grow Mix

Prairie Garden Plan

Introduce this low-growing blend for beauty, biodiversity and bloom to your native Oklahoma soil.

1. 'Fireworks' Evening Primrose x10
(*Oenothera fruticosa*)
Mature size: 1.5'x2.0'
2. Side Oats Grass x15
(*Bouteloua curtipendula*)
Mature size: 2.5'x2.0'
3. Nodding Onion x15
(*Allium cernuum*)
Mature size: 2.0'x1.5'
4. Dwarf Red Mexican Hat x5
(*Ratibida 'Red Midget'*)
Mature size: 15"x18"
5. 'Summer Sunshine' Coreopsis x5
(*Coreopsis palustris*)
Mature size: 30"x40"



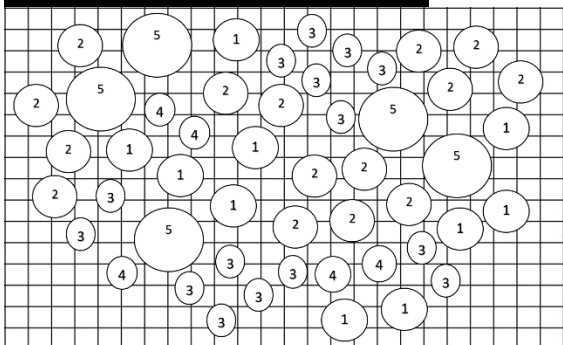
Description: This flexible mix includes prairie groundcovers and low growers from the Oklahoma region. Boost the aesthetics of your low-maintenance lawn, or compliment taller prairie plants with these drought-tolerant natives. You will enjoy an approximately 6-month long bloom season with a variety of colors, and textures. This mix plants roughly 100 sq. feet at maturity.

Directions: Plant in full sun (8+ hours direct sun) with moderate to well-drained soil. Water your plants regularly the first year in the ground. After the first year, water deeply once a week, or as needed. Once established, these tough plants will thrive in Oklahoma's brutal summer without the need of daily watering- an eco-friendly way to save money on your water bill. Prune late winter before new growth arrives in spring. Maximize pollinator activity with a pollinator water station.

Design Layout: each square = 1 foot



1) "Fireworks" Evening Primrose Early summer bloom, multi-color interest, attracts pollinators and supports native bees, heat/drought tolerant once established, and deer resistant. Zone 4-8.



2) Side Oats Grass Vertical interest, Soil stability, provides wildlife forage/shelter, arching interest, capturing movement, multi-season interest, cut flower, drought tolerant. Zone 3-8.



3) Nodding Onion Vertical interest, attracts pollinators, great for mass plantings, interesting bell-shaped pink/purple flowers, heat/drought tolerant once established. Zone 4-8.



4) Dwarf Red Mexican Hat Interesting cone heads, multi-color flower good for small pollinators, fine green-gray foliage texture, very tough perennial, very drought tolerant. Zone 3-10.



5) "Summer Sunshine" Coreopsis Bright, prolific blooms extend into fall for a late color display, sturdy growth habit, tolerates wet roots for extended periods of time, attracts birds and pollinators. Zone 6-9.
