Create a biodiverse garden of stunning colors, and textures that exemplify Oklahoma's majestic prairies.



1. Yellow Prairie Grass x5
(*Sorghastrum nutans* 'golden sunset')
Mature size: 6'x3'



2. Bee Balm x10
(*Monarda fistulosa*)
Mature size: 4.5'x3'



3. Little Bluestem Grass x10
(*Schizocarpium scoparium*)
Mature size: 6'x3'



4. Purple Coneflower x5
(*Echinacea purpurea*)
Mature size: 2.5'x2'



5. Rattlesnake Master x5
(*Eryngium yuccifolium*)
Mature size: 4'x3'



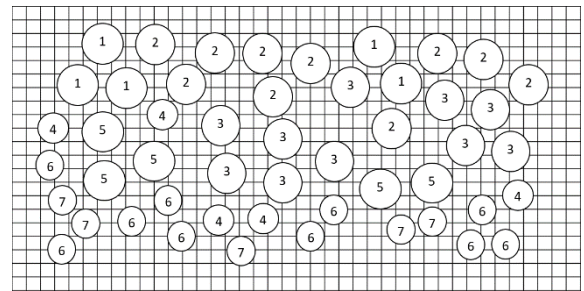
6. Milkweed x10
(*Schizocarpium scoparium*)
Mature size: 1'x2'



7. Blue Jacket Spiderwort x5
(*Tradescantia ohioensis*)
Mature size: 2'x2'



Design Layout each square = 1 foot



Description: This blend includes a large variety of prairie plants with varying textures, colors, and growth habits from the Oklahoma region. Enjoy vibrant, heat-loving blooms during the dog days of summer when non-native perennials tend to decline. Seeds heads and dormant foliage provide visual interest, forage, and protection for wildlife. This mix plants roughly 135 sq. feet at maturity.

Directions: Plant in full sun (8+ hours direct sun) with moderate to well-drained soil. Water your plants regularly the first year in the ground. After the first year, water deeply once a week, or as needed. Once established, these tough plants will thrive in Oklahoma's brutal summer without the need of daily watering- an eco-friendly way to save money on your water bill. Prune late winter before new growth arrives in spring.

1) Yellow Prairie Grass Vertical interest, capturing movement, large golden seed heads, multi-season interest, deer/rabbit resistant, drought tolerant. Zone 3-9.

2) Bee Balm Unique lavender flowers, fragrant/edible (mint family), attracts birds/hummingbirds/butterflies/bees, cut flowers, drought tolerant. Zone 3-9.

3) Little Bluestem Grass Vertical interest, capturing movement, multi-season interest, shiny seed tufts in fall, establishes quickly, drought tolerant. Zone 3-10.

4) Purple Coneflower Unique lavender flowers, fragrant/edible (mint family), attracts birds/hummingbirds/butterflies/bees, cut flowers, drought tolerant. Zone 3-9.

5) Rattlesnake Master Unique lavender flowers, fragrant/edible (mint family), attracts birds/hummingbirds/butterflies/bees, cut flowers, drought tolerant. Zone 3-9.

6) Milkweed Ground cover, bright orange flower clusters, pollinator host plant, establishes quickly, drought tolerant. Zone 4-9.

7) Blue Jacket Spiderwort Showy blue/purple-tinged flower clusters with grass-like leaves, prefers some shade from neighboring plants, drought tolerant. Zone 3-9.
